Cuyahoga Family and Children First Council

Who We Serve: (2012-2013)*

- 5,019 youth received out-of-school time services
- 514 youth serving providers received professional development
- 2,501 youth received transition services
- 1,246 youth received tutoring services
- 190 youth participated in youth engagement activities
- 132 youth and families participated in service coordination
- 162 families received relief assistance
- 1,258 youth and families received community-based wraparound
- 2,706 HMG family home visits for 396 children
- 130 families graduated from the families and schools together (FAST) program across 14 school/community-based sites

* Programs numbers cover 12 months of service. Time spans may vary based on funding streams
