II – REVIEW MINUTES – 8/1/2022

Michael Chambers motioned to approve the minutes from the August 1, 2022 meeting; Leigh Tucker seconded. The minutes were approved by unanimous vote, as written.

Stephen Witt, Department of Human Resources, presented. James Boyle asked why this request had not been processed and submitted for approval earlier; asked what occurred after June 29, 2022, which further delayed approval; said that a more detailed timeline would have been helpful and would have answered some additional questions regarding the delays; and asked if the gap refers to gap in approval and not in services. Paul Porter said he would need to review the item history for additional information that led to the delays in approval and asked Mr. Witt if he is aware of any issues during Department of Purchasing's review; said that part of the responsibility falls on the vendor to ensure the correct entity is registered in Strategic Sourcing when their proposal is submitted; and said that departments submit the timelines for late submittal in the backup materials and can look at asking for updated timelines, when necessary. Nan Baker asked for clarification on the gap in services referenced in the backup materials; and said that there is a risk that late items would not get a majority vote, as the Board is being asked to approve after the fact. Michael Chambers said that the risk lies with the vendor since the contract had not yet been approved; said a better timeline would be helpful to address questions regarding this type of scenario; and said that government requires a lot of paperwork, in addition to equity requirements, inclusion, goals and law approval, which all lead to delays in the approval process, that outside agencies are not subject to. Dale Miller asked if the recommended vendor is the current provider; asked who provided services since 6/30/2022; and asked if the vendor agreed to provide services prior to approval. Michael Chambers motioned to approve the item; James Boyle seconded. Item BC2022-473 was approved by unanimous vote.

Scope of Work Summary

The Department of Public Works is requesting an Exemption with U.S. Bank that will result in a not-to-exceed purchase order set up to cover routine fuel purchases for the County Fleet Division through a banking platform. The amount of the purchase order will be not-to-exceed \$300,000.00 and cover expenses through December 31, 2022. This will allow County vehicles operating in the field to be fueled and continued operations.

The primary goal is to ensure the County can continue to purchase fuel for County vehicles using the U.S. Bank Voyager card program.

Procurement

The procurement method being requested is an Exemption resulting in a not-to-exceed purchase order. US Bank was the service provider in the past through the County’s Key Bank contract and the County will continue to partner with this vendor.
