<p>Sponsored by: County Executive Budish/Department of Public Safety and Justice Services/Office of Emergency Management</p>	<p>A Resolution authorizing a revenue generating agreement with Olmsted Township in the amount not-to-exceed \$555,000.00 for Cuyahoga Emergency Communications System emergency dispatch services for the period 10/31/2017 - 10/30/2020; authorizing the County Executive to execute the agreement and all other documents consistent with this Resolution; and declaring the necessity that this Resolution become immediately effective.</p>
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WHEREAS, the County Executive/Department of Public Safety and Justice Services/Office of Emergency Management has recommended a revenue generating agreement with Olmsted Township in the amount not-to-exceed \$555,000.00 for Cuyahoga Emergency Communications System emergency dispatch services for the period 10/31/2017 - 10/30/2020; and

WHEREAS, Olmsted Township desires to continue working with Cuyahoga Emergency Communications System (“CECOMS”) for the transfer of responsibility for emergency dispatch services for the residents of Olmsted Township; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary that this Resolution become immediately effective in order that critical services provided by Cuyahoga County can continue and to provide for the usual, daily operation of a County entity.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO:

SECTION 1. The Cuyahoga County Council hereby authorizes a revenue generating agreement with Olmsted Township in the amount not-to-exceed \$555,000.00 for Cuyahoga Emergency Communications System emergency dispatch services for the period 10/31/2017 - 10/30/2020.

SECTION 2. That the County Executive is authorized to execute the agreement and all other documents consistent with this Resolution.

SECTION 3. It is necessary that this Resolution become immediately effective for the usual, daily operation of the County; the preservation of public peace, health, or safety in the County; and any additional reasons set forth in the preamble.

Provided that this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of at least eight members of Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon the earliest occurrence of any of the following: (1) its approval by the County Executive through signature, (2) the expiration of the time during which it may be disapproved by the County Executive under Section 3.10(6) of the Cuyahoga County Charter, or (3) its passage by at least eight members of Council after disapproval pursuant to Section 3.10(7) of the Cuyahoga County Charter. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

SECTION 4. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of the Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

On a motion by Mr. Gallagher, seconded by Mr. Miller, the foregoing Resolution was duly adopted.
