Resolution No. R2020-0012

Sponsored by: **County Executive Budish/Department of Public Works/Division of County Engineer**

A Resolution authorizing a Construction Agreement with CSX Transportation, Inc. in the amount not-to-exceed \$666,549.00 for preliminary engineering services, flagging and other protective services and devices, and construction engineering and inspection services in connection with replacement of Memphis Road Bridge No. 00.62 in the City of Brooklyn; authorizing the County Executive to execute the agreement and all other documents consistent with this Resolution; and declaring the necessity that this Resolution become immediately effective.

WHEREAS, the County Executive/Department of Public Works/Division of County Engineer has recommended a Construction Agreement with CSX Transportation, Inc. in the amount not-to-exceed \$666,549.00 for preliminary engineering services, flagging and other protective services and devices, and construction engineering and inspection services in connection with replacement of Memphis Road Bridge No. 00.62 in the City of Brooklyn; and

WHEREAS, the project is located in Council District 3; and

WHEREAS, the anticipated start date is 2020; and

WHEREAS, the funding for this project is 80% from Federal funds and 20% from Road and Bridge Funds; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary that this Resolution become immediately effective in order that critical services provided by Cuyahoga County can continue and to provide for the usual, daily operation of a County entity.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO:

SECTION 1. That the Cuyahoga County Council hereby authorizes a Construction Agreement with CSX Transportation, Inc. in the amount not-to-exceed \$666,549.00 for preliminary engineering services, flagging and other protective services and devices, and construction engineering and inspection services in

connection with replacement of Memphis Road Bridge No. 00.62 in the City of Brooklyn.

SECTION 2. That the County Executive is authorized to execute the agreement and all other documents consistent with this Resolution.

SECTION 3. It is necessary that this Resolution become immediately effective for the usual daily operation of the County; the preservation of public peace, health or safety in the County; and any additional reasons set forth in the preamble. Provided that this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of at least eight members of Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon the earliest occurrence of any of the following: (1) its approval by the County Executive through signature, (2) the expiration of the time during which it may be disapproved by the County Executive under Section 3.10(6) of the Cuyahoga County Charter, or (3) its passage by at least eight members of Council after disapproval pursuant to Section 3.10(7) of the Cuyahoga County Charter. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

SECTION 4. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of the Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
