## Resolution No. R2023-0123

<b>Sponsored by: County Executive Ronayne/Department of Development</b>	<b>A Resolution</b> making awards to various municipalities and agencies in the total amount of \$1,363,295.72 for various projects or programs in connection with the 2023 Community Development Supplemental Grant Program for the period 4/1/2023 – 3/31/2024; authorizing the County Executive to execute the agreements and contracts and all other documents consistent with said awards and this Resolution; and declaring the necessity that this Resolution become immediately effective.

**WHEREAS**, the County Executive/Department of Development recommends awards to various municipalities and agencies, in the total amount of \$1,413,295.72 for various projects or programs in connection with the 2023 Community Development Supplemental Grant Program for the period 4/1/2023 – 3/31/2024; and

**WHEREAS**, the participants of the 2023 CDSG Program have been chosen from the twenty-seven (27) communities and four (4) non-profit organizations that submitted applications; and

**WHEREAS**, the Department of Development and a review committee reviewed and analyzed each of the applications based on scoring criteria which evaluates participants based on project description, proposed project feasibility and implementation plan; and

**WHEREAS**, based on the scoring criteria, the following is a list of the supplemental grant projects or programs recommend for awards as follows:

- a) City of Bay Village in the amount not-to-exceed \$50,000.00 for The Village Green;

- x) City of Parma in the amount not-to-exceed \$50,000.00 for Ukranian Village and Polish Village Streetscape Improvement Phase V;
- y) City of Parma Heights in the amount not-to-exceed \$49,686.72 for Restoration of the Cassidy Theatre/Community Center Lobby;
- z) City of Richmond Heights in the amount not-to-exceed \$30,000.00 for Fire Station Roof Replacement;
- aa) City of Shaker Heights in the amount not-to-exceed \$50,000.00 for Home Repair Grant Program;
- bb) City of South Euclid in the amount not-to-exceed \$50,000.00 for South Euclid Park Improvements;

- cc) City of Warrensville Heights in the amount not-to-exceed \$50,000.00 for Richmond & Harvard Street Light Replacement;
- dd) Village of Woodmere in the amount not-to-exceed \$16,060.00 for Public Safety and Traffic Calming Program; and

**WHEREAS**, the awards are funded 100% by Community Development Supplemental Grant Program funds and the municipalities and non-profit organizations are located in County Council District Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, 10 and 11; and

**WHEREAS**, it is necessary that this Resolution become immediately effective in order that critical services provided by Cuyahoga County can continue and to provide for the usual, daily operation of a County entity.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO:**

**SECTION 1.** That the Cuyahoga County Council hereby makes awards to various municipalities and agencies, in the total amount of \$1,413,295.72 for various projects or programs in connection with the 2023 Community Development Supplemental Grant Program for the period 4/1/2023 – 3/31/2024 as follows:

- v) Village of Oakwood in the amount not-to-exceed \$50,000.00 for Tryon Road Pedestrian Safety Improvement Project;
- w) Olmsted Township in the amount not-to-exceed \$50,000.00 for Cook Road Sidewalk Project;
- x) City of Parma in the amount not-to-exceed \$50,000.00 for Ukranian Village and Polish Village Streetscape Improvement Phase V;
- y) City of Parma Heights in the amount not-to-exceed \$49,686.72 for Restoration of the Cassidy Theatre/Community Center Lobby;
- z) City of Richmond Heights in the amount not-to-exceed \$30,000.00 for Fire Station Roof Replacement;
- aa) City of Shaker Heights in the amount not-to-exceed \$50,000.00 for Home Repair Grant Program;
- bb) City of South Euclid in the amount not-to-exceed \$50,000.00 for South Euclid Park Improvements;
- cc) City of Warrensville Heights in the amount not-to-exceed \$50,000.00 for Richmond & Harvard Street Light Replacement;
- dd) Village of Woodmere in the amount not-to-exceed \$16,060.00 for Public Safety and Traffic Calming Program; and

**SECTION 2.** That the County Executive is authorized to execute agreements and contracts in connection with said awards and all other documents consistent with this Resolution.

**SECTION 3.** It is necessary that this Resolution become immediately effective for the usual daily operation of the County; the preservation of public peace, health, and safety in the County; and any additional reasons set forth in the preamble. Provided that this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of at least eight members of Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon the earliest occurrence of any of the following: (1) its approval by the County Executive through

signature, (2) the expiration of the time during which it may be disapproved by the County Executive under Section 3.10(6) of the Cuyahoga County Charter, or (3) its passage by at least eight members of Council after disapproval pursuant to Section 3.10(7) of the Cuyahoga County Charter. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

**SECTION 4.** It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of the Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

On a motion by Ms. Simon, seconded by Ms. Turner, the foregoing Resolution was duly adopted.
